## Glossary

<b>BCG</b>	A vaccine against Tuberculosis
<b>DPT</b>	This is a vaccine against three diseases. These are Diphtheria, Pertussis (whooping cough) and Tetanus.
<b>Exports</b>	This refers to the outward flow of goods and services from a defined territory/country to the rest of the world
<b>GDP</b>	The total value of all final goods and services produced within an economy during a specified period.
<b>GDP Implied Deflator</b>	It is a measure of the level of prices of all new, domestically produced, final goods and services in an economy.
<b>Gross Value Added</b>	This is a measure of the value of goods and services produced in an area, industry or sector of an economy.
<b>Imports</b>	This refers to the Inflow of goods and services into a defined territory/country from the rest of the world
<b>Labour Force</b>	The labour force is defined simply as the people who are willing and able to work. It constitutes of both employed and unemployed persons.
<b>LGA</b>	Local Government Areas (LGAs) are districts, cities or municipalities demarcated under Part 1 of Schedule 1 of the Local Government Act of 2002. There are currently eight Local Government Areas, namely, Banjul, Kanifing, Brikama, Mansakonko, Kerewan, Kuntaur, Janjanbureh and Basse, subdivided into statistical enumeration areas, for the purpose of censuses and other statistical studies.
<b>Mortality</b>	Mortality rate, or death rate, is a measure of the number of deaths (in general, or due to a specific cause) in a particular population, scaled to the size of that population, per unit of time.
<b>PENTA</b>	The pentavalent vaccine is a combination of five vaccines in one: diphtheria, tetanus, whooping cough, hepatitis B and Haemophilus influenza type b (the bacteria that causes meningitis, pneumonia and otitis)
<b>Population Density</b>	Number of persons per square kilometre of land
<b>Total Fertility Rate</b>	The TFR sums up, in a single number, the fertility of all women at a given point in time i.e. the number of children women have at a given point in time.
<b>Unemployment Rate</b>	The relax definition of unemployment was used in calculating the unemployment rate in the 2012 Labour Force Survey and it is defined as all those without jobs, who are available for work and looked or did not look for work in the last four weeks. It is expressed as a percentage.
